# COME ON TO GILGAL! - by Pastor Larry Martin

If there is one thing God wants to do, it is to bring us into a place of blessing. Jesus paid a tremendous price for us to be set free from Satan's bondage.

In the book of Joshua, we have a record of when Israel finally began to go into and take possession of the land of promise. God had plans for them to go and possess the land over 40 years earlier, but Israel refused to go in faith and possess it. God's plan was to deliver them from Egypt, cross the Red Sea, and march into Canaan and take the land that was theirs. God was with them to help them, but they saw the strong opposition and were afraid.

How many times have we missed out on something God planned for us but we were afraid to step out and take it? Well, here is Israel about to cross the Jordan into the Promised Land.

Joshua 3:1-4 And Joshua rose early in the morning; and they removed from Shittim, and came to Jordan, he and all the children of Israel, and lodged there before they passed over. And it came to pass after three days, that the officers went through the host; and they commanded the people, saying, When ye see the ark of the covenant of the Lord your God, and the priests the Levites bearing it, then ye shall remove from your place, and go after it. Yet there shall be a space between you and it, about two thousand cubits by measure: come not near unto it, that ye may know the way by which ye must go: for ye have not passed this way heretofore.

You need to read the entire third chapter. What a miraculous thing when the priests carrying the ark of the covenant stepped into the Jordan. The waters began to heap up, way up the river, and all the water ran away toward the Dead Sea. Israel crossed the Jordan on dry land. The priests stood in the midst of the Jordan. God had commanded twelve Israelites to carry twelve stones and stack them in the middle of the river bed.

Joshua 4:9 And Joshua set up twelve stones in the midst of the Jordan, the place where the feet of the priests which bare the ark of the covenant stood: and they are there unto this day. These stones are still stacked in the Jordan today.

Joshua also commanded twelve Israelites to get twelve stones out of the midst of the Jordan and take them where they were to lodge their first night in the Promised Land.

Joshua 4:3 And command ye them, saying, Take you hence out of the midst of Jordan, out of the place where the priests' feet stood firm, twelve stones, and ye shall carry them over with you, and leave them in the lodging place, where ye shall lodge this night. This stack of stones that came out of Jordan was to be a sign for them and their children.

Joshua 4:6-7 That this may be a sign among you, that when your children ask their fathers in time to come, saying, What mean ye by these stones? Then ye shall answer them, that the waters of Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord; when it passed over Jordan, the waters of Jordan were cut off: and these stones shall be for a memorial unto the children of Israel forever. Israel camped the first night in Gilgal and the twelve stones were stacked up in Gilgal.

The word Gilgal means "wheel, to roll away, or remove." Joshua 5:9 And the Lord said unto Joshua, This day have I rolled away the reproach of Egypt from off you. Where-fore the name of the place is called Gilgal unto this day.

In Gilgal, God rolled away the reproach from Israel. Reproach means "disgrace, shame, or scorn."

What was the reproach of Egypt that was on Israel? They had been their slaves to serve and labor for Egypt! They had been in bondage. They had a lower class mentality. When things went wrong during their exile and they ran out of water or food, Israel complained about how much better it was in Egypt eating from the flesh pots. Oh, how we have settled for so little when we should realize we have been made kings and priests, a victorious Body of Christ.

Gilgal was the place God rolled away that shame and disgrace forever. Israel was no longer slaves, no longer in bondage, but were free people. People of Almighty God. People that made the hearts and strength melt in their enemies.

Friend, come on to Gilgal! Come on and let God roll away the reproach of your past life. You are no longer the old man or woman that did those things if you've been born again. If you have not been born again, it's time today. God wants to roll away all the reproach of the past. This is the day of salvation. Today is your Gilgal! Shout the victory because all the work has been done. All you have to do is receive it by faith.

Come on to Gilgal! The stones are stacked as a testimony of a miracle working God that brought us out of Egyptian bondage into a land of promise, a land flowing with milk and honey.

Jesus Christ is the Chief Cornerstone that cannot fail us. Come on to Gilgal! God has rolled away the reproach!

On November 28, 2018, I was headed to my 10-week baby appointment. My husband had to work and get our other kids to school. So I went alone.

The ultrasound tech seemed to be having issues getting a decent scan. After about the third time trying something different, she said, "Mrs. Manley, I'm sorry. I don't see a heartbeat."

I felt like someone punched me in the gut. I couldn't breathe. I called my husband to come be with me. I started crying and asked myself, "How did this happen?" Instantly in my spirit, I said, "This is not God's fault. He gives life. Was it that awful stomach virus I had? Did I get too dehydrated?" I said to God, "This sucks, but I don't blame You! I love You!"

Throughout the day, my heart shattered. My husband and I had to call everyone and tell them we were not expecting anymore. My three beautiful children cried and cried. My husband and I cried. Then I saw that the more I cried, the more they cried. I told myself that I couldn't keep doing this to my kids and my husband. I knew I had to deal with my grief but I didn't know how. So I said, "God, please walk me through this."

I had been loving the song "Surrounded." "It may look like I'm surrounded, but I'm surrounded by You. This is how I fight my battles."

One Sunday morning in January, the dance team was about to dance. Mrs. Lisa gave a word about being complacent. Then Mrs. Pam stood up and said how Pastor Mike had told her to worship her way through the cancer, even when she didn't feel like it. Then Mr. Frank got up and read a couple of scriptures and talked about turning the page.

After service, God spoke to me and said, "I gave you the directions on how to get through this." So, He literally laid a specific song on my heart every week. The first song was "Way Maker." The next song was "So Good to Me." I feel like that song was written for me. Some of the lyrics are "You are good in the fire, You stay beside me. Good in the valley when fear surrounds me. Good on the mountain. Good through the victory. You're so good to me. You take the pain, I take the promises."

I began to feel God heal me through worship, but some things were still painful. Baby announcements, pictures, seeing baby clothes and knowing my baby was not coming.

A few weeks later, Pastor called my husband and I and our kids up for prayer. He said, "Y"all have been through a tragedy. God wants to take away the pain." I have not felt the pain since that day!

#### My Cardboard Testimony by Pam Stapler

The front side of my cardboard testimony says "Husband sent to prison. Hurt. Angry. Fearful of what would happen to me." The back side says "Marriage restored. Forgave. Know God holds me in His hands." Now, here's the back story!

My husband was sent to prison. My life as I had known it was over. I was afraid and scared. We had two small daughters at the time. I knew that I had to focus on me and my children, so while he was in there, I got more involved with my church. I began to feel myself getting a little stronger each and every day. Still not understanding why things were happening the way they were, I divorced my husband and continued to pray and seek God.

After four years, my ex-husband was released from prison. I was determined not to have this man back in my life. When I dropped our girls off to see their dad for the first time, I saw a man standing in the kitchen, but it took me a few minutes to figure out who he was. It was my ex-husband! See, he went to prison for drugs - he manufactured them along with being a dealer. When he went to prison, he was 290-300 pounds. I am standing here looking at this man who is around 175 pounds that I had never seen before.

While I was out here wondering and pushing forward, God had taken this man, the father of my children, and saved his soul and changed his life. He turned him into a truly wonderful man of God!

I watched as the days went by and slowly we became friends. Then God moved and completely restored my family. We were remarried and we now have a wonderful life.

When he was in prison, he met Ye Visited Me Ministries. God use the wonderful people in that ministry to minister to my husband - to encourage him, to love him, and to give him what he needed at the time. God put them in his life when he so desperately needed them.

He told me all about them and one day in 2017, I got to meet them myself. We were finally able to find the Pastor, Larry Martin, and his church, Souls Harbor. I was skeptical the first visit. But we went back and I had never experienced more love and kindness before in a church. These people truly loved us. They didn't even know me, but they loved us.

We joined the church and I have begun to go into the prisons with the team and help minister. What a wonderful ministry to love and encourage people that feel so unloved. To help show them a better way.

#### Healing Keys to Rejection - by Reno Olds

What does rejection mean? Refusal to take; discarding or throwing out as useless; or a denial of acceptance, love, care, etc. to someone. Regardless of how one defines rejection, one thing is certain - the person on the receiving end is hurting. Rejection isn't pleasant!

Rejection is hard to handle. People in counseling and psychiatric professions maintain that it is one of the most difficult problems for the human personality to adjust to. I agree! Rejection can leave scars that are embedded deep within our emotions and thought processes. Rejection can mar our self image. Praise God that He offers healing to everyone who has known rejection. Jesus came to mend broken hearts!

I don't believe anyone can say, "I've never been rejected." All of us have been rejected on one level or another. It may have been by a mate, a parent, a teacher, a friend, an employee, or an employer. Perhaps they were people you liked and wanted acceptance from, but they turned their backs on you. Regardless of who or why, rejection hurts!

Some people feel that rejection takes a long time to heal, or that it can never be healed. According to the Word, it doesn't take long at all. All we need are some answers - keys that are able to free us. I am going to give you a few simple keys that you can use to take care of rejection in your life. Then you will also be able to use them when ministering to others who come to you feeling rejected.

One of the first keys to healing from rejection is having strong faith. Sometimes when we first hear faith teaching, we are so busy confessing, we are not always honest before the Lord. Sometimes I think this is an error and a device of the devil. We need to go before the Lord and say, "This is a mess! This is a problem!" David let it all hang out, yet he was a mighty man of faith. He was called a man after God's own heart. If you are a person after God's own heart, you can please Him by being a person of faith. So, walk in the light of the Word and be a doer of the Word and not just a hearer. And have faith.

The next key is the anointing. There are times when you will face difficult situations and circumstances. You will need a special anointing just for them. You need special anointings to "put you over" during hard times. There is another man in Genesis 37 named Joseph, who had favor with his father. Jacob gave him a coat of many colors, but his brothers were jealous of him. Verse 11 said they envied him. Listen, sometimes there will be a spirit of jealousy creep in when it comes to family, but you have to notice it when it does because when he shared his dream, ... well, you know the story. He was thrown into the pit, then sold, then went to Egypt. He went from prison to being Pharaoh's right hand man in all of Egypt. Read Genesis chapters 37 through 43. God restored him and his family because Joseph did not give up. There was an anointing on him for dreams and for his healing.

Key #3 is: It is God's will to set you FREE! I want to establish this in your hearts. Psalm 147:2-3 tells us "the Lord doth build up Jerusalem: He gathereth together the outcasts of Israel. He healeth the broken in heart, and bindeth up their wounds." Basically, what are rejected people? They are outcasts. God is concerned about people who are outcasts. He gathers and restores them. He loves to gather in outcasts and heal their wounds. When you say, "I'm a wounded one, my personality has been hurt, I have been rejected," God says, "I just love you. I will set you at liberty."

Remember, it's God's will to set you free from the feelings of rejection. In Luke 4:18, we read that Jesus came to set at liberty those who are bruised. "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty." The Spirit of the Lord will set you free.

Do these three things and you will live a victorious life from rejection:

- 1) Praise. Why do we praise the Lord? Praise sets us free, because healing comes while praising the Lord.
- 2) Be baptized in the Holy Ghost. Be filled and pray in the Spirit an hour or two every day.
- 3) Sometimes just repent. Psalm 41:4 says, *I said, Lord, be merciful unto me: heal my soul; for I have sinned against thee.* You have rehearsed the problem and rehearsed the problem long enough. So, instead of rehearsing the problem, repent of your murmuring.

Psalm 23:3 He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

Jeremiah 8:22 Is there no balm in Gilead; is there no physician there? Why then is not the health of the daughter of my people recovered?

Romans 8:26-27 Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.
